Mayoor School, Ajmer (First Mayoor Invitational English Debate 2023)

The competition was held on **O1st and O2nd September**. The debates were conducted with rigor and decorum, fostering an environment of healthy competition and intellectual exchange. Not only did the event provide a platform for students to showcase their debating skills, it also encouraged them to expand their horizons by researching and presenting well-informed arguments.

Day 1 witnessed three preliminary rounds. Team RKK was proposition. While Mayo took the debate, the margin was very close. For the 2nd prelims, team RKK was against Team 1 from the Host school, Mayoor, and the agenda was 'THR "True Crime" entertainment'. Team RKK was opposition. Although by a close margin, we didn't win this debate. In the last prelims, Team RKK was against Rajkumar College Rajkot, and the agenda was 'THBT privileged individuals from minority communities should opt out of affirmative action.' Team RKK was opposition and won this debate by a wide margin. Aarohi Bhattacherjee was also adjudged the 'Best Speaker' in this round. The next day witnessed the Quarter finals, the Semi-Finals and the mega Finals. Team RKK made it into the quarter finals and debated on the motion 'THS the implementation of anti-democratic measures during times of global pandemics' against the Mayo College, Ajmer. Although a close margin, we lost against Mayo College and couldn't make it into the Semi-Finals. The Mayoor Invitational Debate for seniors not only celebrated the power of rhetoric but also nurtured the next generation of critical thinkers and communicators, making it a valuable and enriching experience for all schools.






St. Stithians Girl's College in South Africa (RS Zoom Postcard)

On 6th of September, a team consisting of two debaters- Shreya Parakh & Piya Salecha, a researcher - Avantika Mishra with their accompanying teacher, Ms Reena Mishra embarked from the gates of RKK on a journey to **Pinegrove School, Solan, Himachal Pradesh.** As the morning sun of the **7th September** welcomed us, we were greeted by the breath taking sight of Solan's lush green mountains, setting the stage for our participation in the prestigious 6th Mohinder Memorial Bilingual Turncoat Debate. This event brought together renowned schools such as RIMC Dehradun, Emerald Heights International School, Indore, Vidya Devi Jindal School Hisar, PGS, Solan, RKKGPS, Jodhpur, and many others. The Preliminary round divided participants into two pools: Pool A and Pool B. In the evening, the draw of lots determined the speaking order for the participants, while the escort teachers revealed the topics. Students may not have won the competition but at the end of the day they enriched their minds by gaining a lot of knowledge and wisdom from their co-debaters, co-participants and judges.






Ivanhoe Grammar School, Australia (RS Zoom Postcard)






Dainfern College in South Africa (RS Zoom Postcard)

An Interactive Session by by Dr. Santosh Khokeron Adolescent Health Awareness

An Interactive Session by Dr. Santosh Khoker (Associate Professor, Department of Obstetrics and Gynaecology) on **September 26, 2023 at RKKGPS, Jodhpur.** Students of Classes IX To XII attended an interactive session on 'Adolescent Health Awareness' conducted by Dr Santosh Khoker and her team on September 26, 2023 in the BRS Auditorium of Rajmata Krishna Kumari Girls' Public School. The esteemed doctor and her team members were welcomed by Mrs. Seema Baxi, the DEAN Academics, Seniors. According to WHO, Adolescence is the phase of life between childhood and adulthood, from ages 10 to 19. It is a unique stage of human development and an important time for laying the foundations of good health. Celebrating the 9th decade of Umaid Hospital and stressing upon the importance of maintaining health and hygiene among adolescents, Dr Santosh Khoker, Associate Professor, Department of Obstetrics and Gynaecology, SN Medical College, Jodhpur encouraged girls to speak freely about the physiological changes in their bodies. She said, "This is the healthiest but also the most problematic time for an adolescent".

Dr Santosh said that adolescents face changes at physical, emotional and mental levels. They can stay fit at all levels by eating healthy, home-cooked food, exercising regularly and drinking at least 8 glasses of water daily. She further said, "Since young people are our future assets, attention to their health is the next logical step". She informed the adolescents how menstrual hygiene can be maintained. In the enlightening one-hour session, the learned doctor spoke of pursuing one's passion. According to Dr. Santosh, youngsters must understand that success is not synonymous to any profession, in fact if one follows their passion, they will stay happy. The session culminated with an interesting question-answer session in which the youngsters clarified their doubts on topics ranging avoiding mood swings to menstrual hygiene.






