



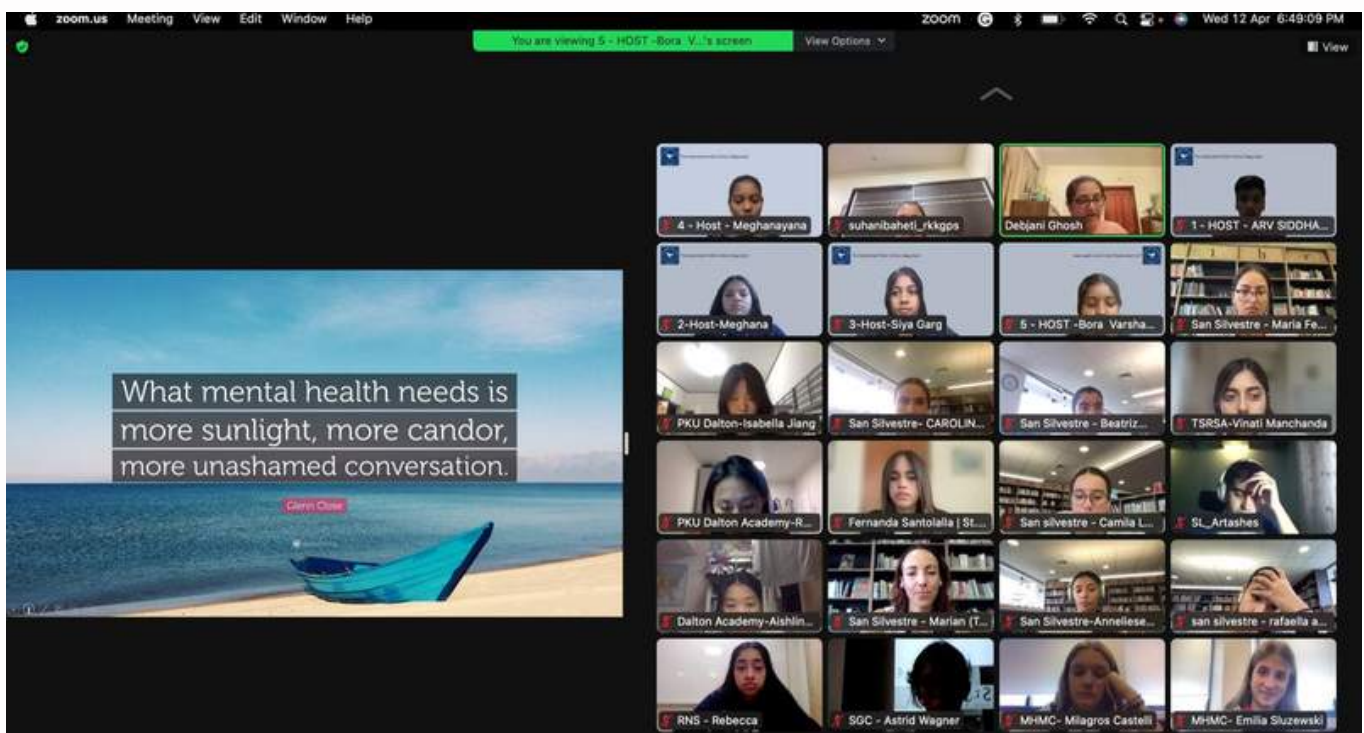

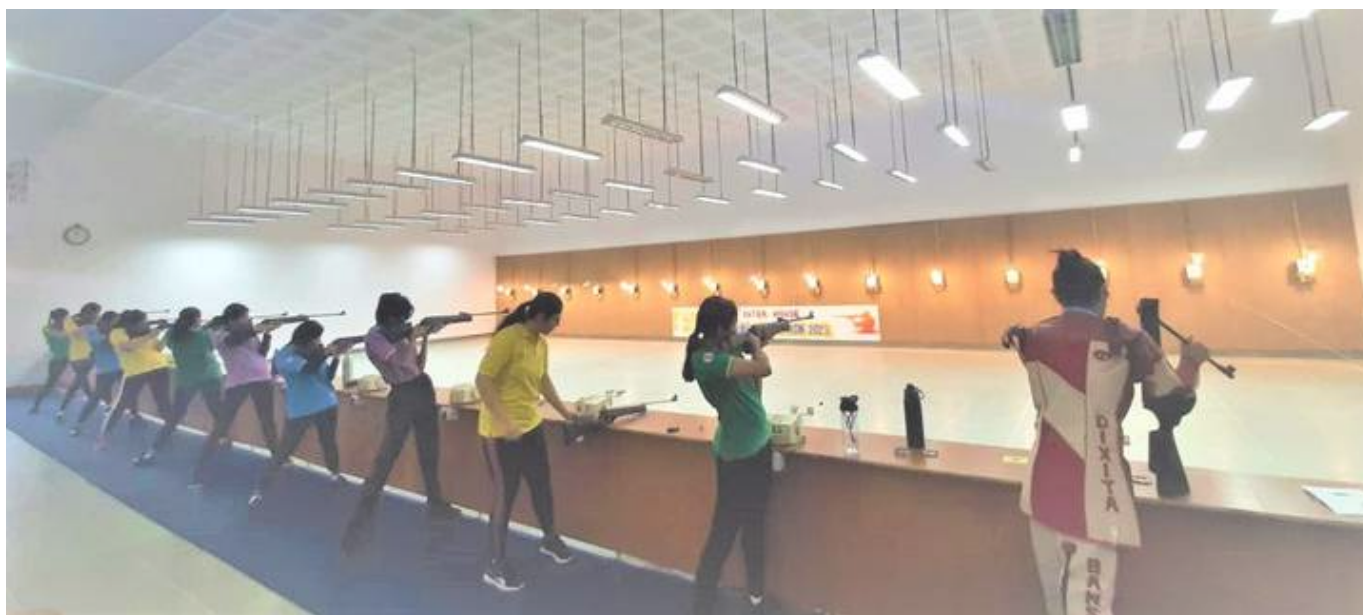

Finally every team expressed their gratitude towards the host school and Round Square, having had meaningful conversations, thoughtful ideas, a whole new take on the topic and obviously making new friendships.

A team of six students - Divya Vishnoi and Jaya Sankhla participated in the Padmashree JK Kate Memorial Hindi Debate, Varalika Sharma and Ira Bishnoi in the DF Jack Memorial English Debate and Suhani Baheti and Nehal Gehlot participated in the PG Miller Memorial Quiz - 2023 organized by Daly College, Indore on 19th & 20th April 2023. A total of 14 schools participated : Pinegrove School Solan, Scindia Kanya Vidyalaya Gwalior, Daly College Indore, The Sanskar Valley Bhopal, Mayo College Girls' School Ajmer, Mayo College Ajmer, Mody School Laxmangarh, The Emerald Heights' International School Indore, Sunbeam School Varuna, Sunbeam School Lahartara, The Doon School Dehradun, The Scindia School Gwalior, Welham Girls' School Dehradun and Rajmata Krishna Kumari Girls' Public School, Jodhpur.

In the preliminary round of the Hindi Debate, the motion was **"Desh ki pragati keval yuvaon pe nirbhar hai"**. The Hindi debaters were able to showcase their skills and as a result qualified for the quarter finals. The motion for the quarter finals was **"Is sadan ka manna hai ki G20 ki aadhykshta ke madhyam se bharat naam vyavastha ka netratau kareng"**. They went against Pinegrove School Dharampur and successfully made their way into the next round. The motion for the semi finals was **"Manna hai ki achha bura kuch nahi hota sab kuch paristithyon par nirbhar karta hai"**. The delegates debated against Emerald Heights International School Indore.

The English Debaters qualified the Preliminary Round and entered the Quarter Finals. In the Preliminary Round they debated in the Turncoat Modified format in which Varalika spoke FOR the motion, whereas Ira spoke AGAINST the motion. The workshop aimed to provide training and support to young people to discover their potential, find their purpose, passion and place in the world through the non-formal education framework of the Duke of Edinburgh's International Award. It allowed participants to gain in-depth knowledge and understanding of the IAYP program. The Training Sessions were conducted by Mr Bivujit Mukhoty, India-Head of IAYP and an experienced trainer and has been associated with the IAYP for several years. His expertise and knowledge were invaluable to the participants.

The workshop covered various aspects of the IAYP program, including the three levels of the award - Gold, Silver and Bronze, detailed sessions on the five pillars of the program - Physical Recreation, Skill, Service, Adventurous Journey and Gold Residential work.

The training also included information on how to set up an IAYP unit in a school or organization, including the registration process, planning and implementing activities, and managing and recording participant progress. Participants were provided with practical examples and case studies of successful IAYP programs. The National Training Workshop on IAYP was great success, providing valuable knowledge and training to all participants. The content was well-structured, informative and practical. The participants were able to gain a good understanding of the IAYP program, and the certificate provided a recognition of their learning with an expectation that the participants will be able to take their learning back to their respective schools and implement the IAYP program effectively.





## Inter Cultural Exchange Program (Sending) with Maa Anandmayee Memorial School, Raiwala (Dehradun)

This was done to provide awareness about the initiative. Followed by which, a 'Nukkad Natak' was performed by our girls throwing more light on the stigma attached to menstrual hygiene. The skit was received by a lot of cheer among the crowd. After which, the distribution of the Sanitary Napkins to the women jail inmates was done by our students. The Community Service was also done under the aegis of AFS India, keeping in mind the 'Global Youth Service Day' (GYSD). In the Women's Central Jail, we were accompanied by three escort teachers – Asha Kachhawaha, Deepmala Bhandari & Meenakshi Jain. The whole session was very well received by everyone over there. They very much appreciated the efforts put in by the students and considered the service as something very inspirational and motivational.



## Teachers' Workshop on POCSO (Virtual)

A very informative and Interactive Session on POCSO held on **28th April on Zoom platform** from 3:30 to 6: 00 pm was attended by Mrs Seema Baxi, Mrs Sapna Gupta, Mrs Neeta Johari, Mrs Indra Shaktawat, Deans of RKK and Ms Aashna Jain School Counsellor. It was very well conducted by Right Side Story curated by the dedicated team of Child Psychologists & Legal experts.

Their presentation covered all the Acts of POCSO in detail. The session was very informative and eye opening. The facilitators were highly effective in delivering the objectives of the session. They work in the space of Child Safeguarding through their digital and on-ground training and aim to help & support educational institutions to fight abuse against children. It was an effort to make school safer for children providing professional Legal Literacy & Child Safety Trainings to Schools for a **LARGER IMPACT**, creating **AWARENESS** on the Child Sexual Abuse, its causes to understand child safety concepts, equipping Key Stakeholders on **CSA PREVENTION** to create “culture of safety” for Children.

### Teenage: An age of confusion or enlightenment?

We've all wondered about teenage being the most fascinating of all the stages due to the many changes an individual goes through and its effects on teenagers' overall personality and life. A session for teachers was taken by the **School Counsellor, Ms. Aashna Jain, on the Mental Health of Adolescents on the 29th April 2023**. The session aimed at making teachers aware of the basic signs and symptoms of different disorders related to a child's mental health, providing primary-level support, and being able to refer the child for professional help, if need be. It didn't aim to teach the teachers how to diagnose or treat any mental illness but to keep a check on the warning signs.

A powerful video was shown that showcased how many teenagers do not report the fact that they are going through a hard time and therefore, refrain from seeking help. Stating the WHO statistics, she stressed that depression, anxiety, and behavioral disorders are among the leading causes of illness and disability among adolescents and Gen Z is more prone to developing a mental illness due to lifestyle changes, exposure to media, and many other reasons but they are the most receptive of all generations, and if guided in the right direction, they can do wonders and succeed with vibrant colours.

She then continued by stating the 4 D's that help distinguish mental distress from a mental illness and how it's important to not label anyone. She discussed the warning signs and symptoms of some common mental health disorders like depression, anxiety, stress, ADHD, and SLDs. The teachers were advised to keep a check on every student for the warning signs that manifest themselves in physical, emotional, social, or cognitive ways and also identify the red flags like self-harming behaviours and report them on a priority basis. They were asked to keep the golden rule of "Early Identification for Early Intervention" in mind and were given tips to handle a child who appears to be experiencing mental distress like remaining calm, listening without judgment, building trust, and adopting OLA (Observing, Listen and Act/Ask), etc.

The session ended with situation-based questions that were directed toward the teachers and they shared their best practices in the class and how they dealt with some students in their own creative and thoughtful ways. In the end, they were advised to always take care of themselves first to take care of others because ultimately happy students are made by happy teachers.



## Rashtriya Indian Military College, Dehradun (Inter School Hugh Catchpole English Debates 2023)

Three delegates from grade XII namely, *Aadyaa Vivek*, *Stuti Arya*, and *Suhani Baheti*, accompanied by the Teacher Escort *Mrs. Reshma Bhattacharjee*, left the portals of RKK on the 25th of April and reached the wooded, grassy and extremely beautiful campus of RIMC that offered a breath of fresh air, on 26th April. All of us were in a determined, steady yet calm mindset, ready to represent our school in the **All-India Hugh Catchpole English Debate 2023, hosted by the Rashtriya Indian Military College, Dehradun from 27th to 29th April 2023.**

After a day's rest, we went on to have our debates the next day. There were a total of 16 schools out of which 5 were outstation, whilst others were reputed schools of Dehradun like The Doon School, Welham Girls, The Asian School, and so on.
