- In order to spread ecological awareness, collages were made by the students on different sources of pollution, its harmful effects and importance of clean and green surroundings.
- Students were sensitized towards Ecosystem. They placed earthen bird houses, fodder and water pots for them in the garden.

Term end exams – Half Yearly at the end of 1st Term and Final Examination at the end of the II Term are for 80 marks each.

Discipline (VI to X): The students will also be assessed for the discipline which is based on the factors like attendance, sincerity, behaviour, values, tidiness, respect for rules and regulations. Grading on Discipline will be done term-wise on a 3 point grading scale (A=Outstanding, B= Very Good and C= Fair). There will be issue of Report Cards for all the Classes at the end of each session.

❖ **FOR CLASSES IX & X**

Internal Marks out of 20 are sent by the school to the CBSE and there is Board Examination for 80 marks per subject in Class X. Each Periodical Assessment consists of a Paper Pen Test of 5 Marks and Multiple Assessment Methods of 5 Marks. For these 20 marks - three Periodicals of 10 marks each are conducted. An average of best two periodicals is taken. 5 marks are for Portfolio and 5 marks for Subject Enrichment Activity.

- ❑ Class : IX has Final Examination of 80 marks per subject.
- ❑ Class : X has Board Examination of 80 marks per subject.

Co-Scholastic Activities (Classes VI – X) : For the holistic development of the student, Co-Curricular activities in the following areas are being carried out in CBSE affiliated schools by the teachers and are graded term-wise on a 3 point grading scale (A=Outstanding, B= Very Good and C= Fair). The aspect of regularity, sincere participation, output and teamwork be the generic criteria for grading in the following co-scholastic activities.

- Work Education – Work Education refers to skill – based activities resulting in goods or services useful to the community.
- Art Education (Visual & Performing Art)
- Health and Physical Education (Sports / Martial Arts / Yoga / NCC etc.)

### PTM Activities:

PTM are held at regular intervals to review the activities of the students and seek parents' participations and feedback. Various orientation and awareness programs were organized for the parents through online via zoom/Google cloud meeting.

The Parent Teacher Meetings supported us to make a positive contribution in sustaining the quality of educational transactions that takes place within the school.
