

## Lens Through the **Opening Ceremony**

The Opening Ceremony of the inaugural edition of Inter House RKK MUN was successfully conducted on 22 November 2024 with great enthusiasm. The event began with a warm welcome of the Chief Guest, Ma'am Neera Singh, Principal Rkkgps, by the hosts of that morning, Srishti Jain and Naavya Rathi. They introduced the conference's theme "Diversisync" which emphasises unity through diversity and urges delegates to embrace varied perspectives for collaborative solutions. The token of love was presented by the Dean of Academics Seniors, Ma'am Seema Baxi.

The Executive Boards of both the committees were introduced which included experienced leaders who were committed to fostering meaningful negotiations. The gavels were then presented to the Chairpersons of the two committees, Piya Salecha of the UNGA and Pari Salecha of the DISEC.

This was followed by an inspiring speech by the Chief Guest Ma'am Neera Singh wherein ma'am highlighted her dream of a RKKMUN coming true and the history that has been created through this MUN.

After that, the Chairperson of UNGA Piya Salecha shared her vision for the IHRKKMUN. Then, the Chairperson of DISEC Pari Salecha spoke about her experience and goals for fostering meaningful discussions.



## Day1 of RKKMUN'24











The debates began with the UNGA tackling terrorism and violent extremism. Nations voiced varied perspectives, from India's call for global collaboration wherein they talked abut radicalization to China's multilateral approach prioritizing sovereignty. France, the UK, and the US denounced terrorism, while South Africa and Brazil emphasized addressing root causes like inequality and human rights.

A moderated caucus on the roots of extremism brought diverse strategies. Israel highlighted on the importance of education, the UK focused on counterterrorism technology and the measures they had taken in the past, whereas Japan stressed upon poverty alleviation. This lead to the coming up of a huge crisis in the committee. The crisis left the mouths of all delegates open, it was witnessed by Ma'am Principal and Bursar Sir. The Round Robin saw intense deliberations on the UK's decision to release hostages from Israel and India. While India and China criticized UK's move as a flipping stance, Japan defended the hostages as victims of terrorism.

Through engaging discussions and collaborative problemsolving, the conference embodied the spirit of unity, showcasing the delegates' commitment to diplomacy and progress.

The heat of DISEC focused on the threat of cyber warfare. Delegates engaged in rapid debates wherein the delegate of USA showcased their strong stance while the delegate of China proved out as a strong opposition. The delegate of Japan also put up strong points in both the general committee sessions along with the speeches in the crisis. The executive board handled the committee session smoothly and ensured that recognition pad is kept in check.


