

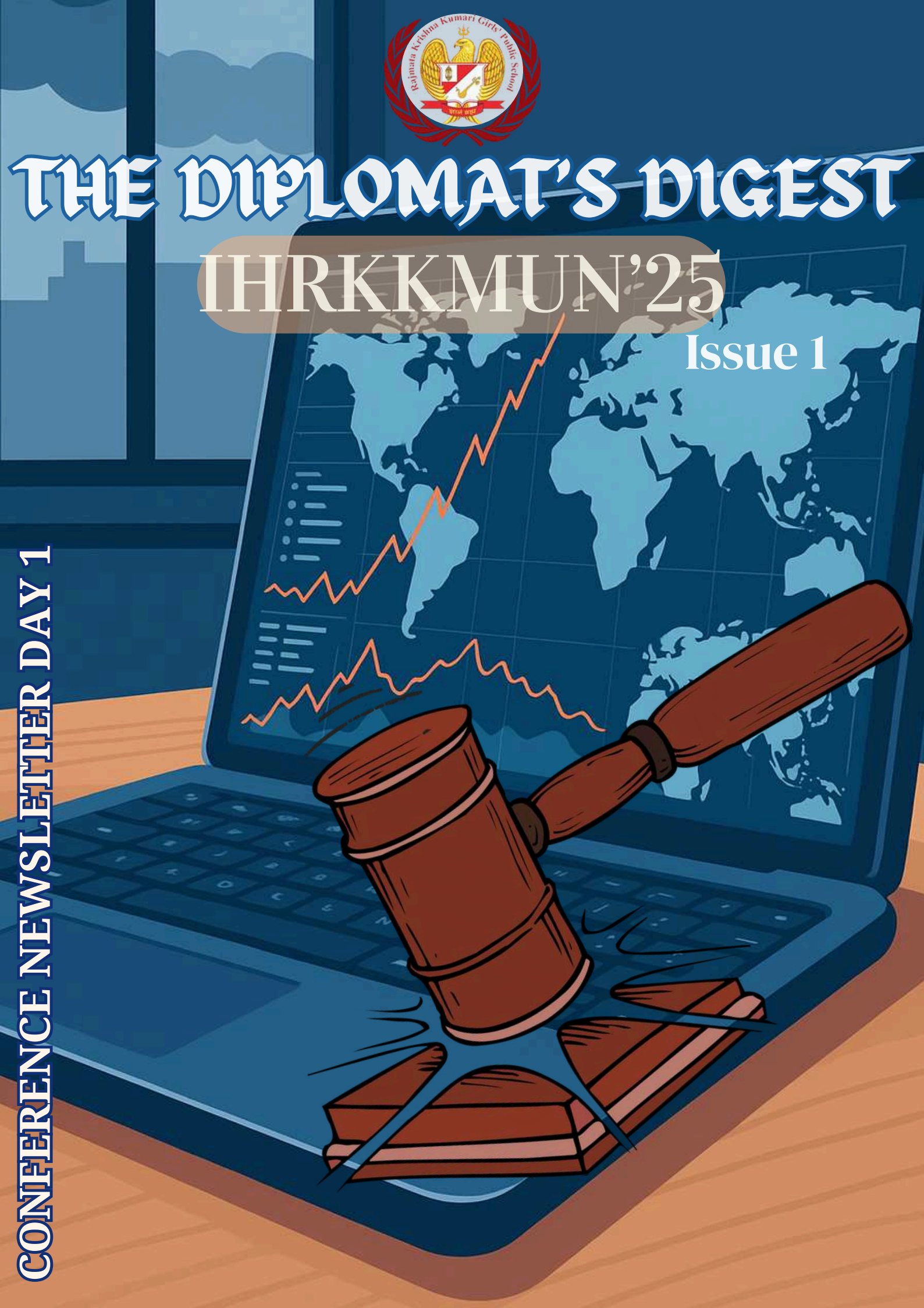

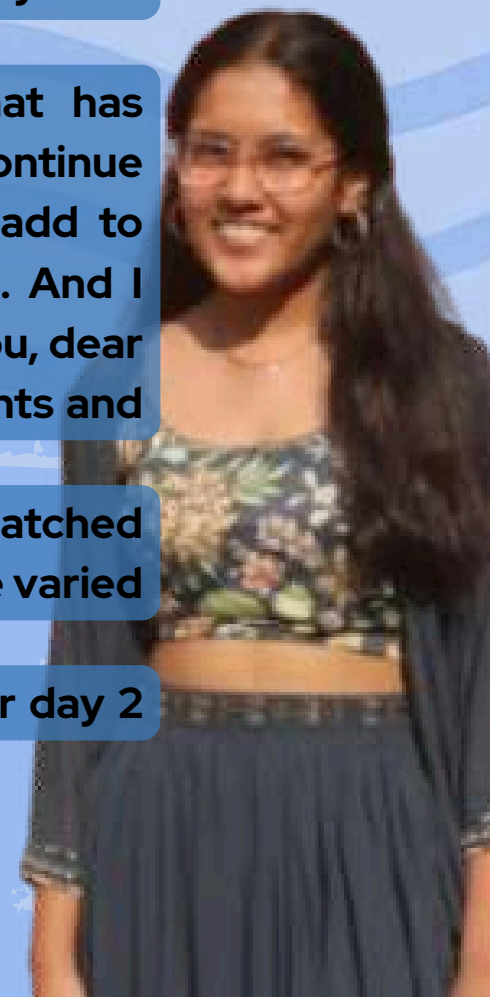

DAY 1 BRIEF

The G20 Committee commenced under extraordinary global turmoil, as delegates confronted the unprecedented crisis of the Taliban seizing control over the United States—shaking the foundations of international diplomacy and security. The committee opened with speeches led by Germany, focusing on terrorism's global spread. France's motion for a moderated caucus on the Taliban's governance passed, while the UK's competing motion on UN recognition failed. At 10:55 AM, the Taliban's Chief interrupted proceedings, declaring control over the U.S. and demanding UN recognition—shifting the tone drastically. Post-crisis, further motions and a 10-minute unmoderated caucus saw intense diplomacy. The day closed with a fun session led by the Secretariat and Chair, sharing stories and ending with a Power Drill to boost morale after a tense session. The ECOSOC convened with urgency and determination, uniting global delegates to confront a simulated crisis threatening international peace, security, and economic stability. Day 1 of the committee opened with energy.

Thirteen nations gave opening remarks, stressing peace and counterterrorism. After a break, an unmoderated caucus led to focused talks on de-dollarization and UN aid to affected populations. A simulated Taliban invasion shook the room, prompting urgent collaboration. Later, the collapse of the US dollar triggered a global market crisis, shifting focus to a Euro-based currency system. The day ended with a feedback session, allowing delegates to reflect, learn, and prepare for the next round of discussion. The day concluded with a power drill conducted by the secretariat on the topic: A reflective journey of present and past of USA.

The All India Political Parties Meet began on a fiery note, as political factions clashed over national security, economic reforms, and the government's response to recent crises, including the Pahalgam attack. Debates on Article 370's abrogation brought focus to unmet promises in Jammu & Kashmir, countered by claims of reduced terrorism and improved governance.

PM Modi defended the move as essential for national unity. Discussions on the Ram Mandir project raised concerns over displacement, with the NDA framing it as a symbol of faith and development, while critics challenged its impact on secular values and affected communities.



OPENING CEREMONY

The Opening Ceremony of the Second edition of Inter House RKKMUN was successfully convened on 3rd July 2025, amidst great fervor and enthusiasm. The event commenced with a warm and cordial welcome of the Chief Guest, Ma'am Neera Singh, Principal RKKGPS, by the hosts, Prachi Jain and Malvika Singh, who eloquently introduced the conference's theme, "Chiaroscuro". This thought-provoking theme emphasizes the interplay of contrasting elements, encouraging delegates to proficiently negotiate complexities and foster collaborative solutions. Thereafter, the Dean of Exchange Programmes, Ma'am Sapna Gupta presented a token of appreciation to the Chief Guest. The Executive Boards of the three committees, comprising seasoned leaders dedicated to facilitating meaningful negotiations, were formally introduced. Subsequently, the gavels were presented to the Chairpersons: Aaroahi Bhattacharjee (G20), Eshal Bindra (ECOSOC), and Laxmi Bishnoi (AIPPM). The Chief Guest, Principal Ma'am, in her thoughtful address, shed light on key global concerns such as the conflict in Gaza, tensions between Iran and Israel, and many more. She urged students to stay informed and compassionate in an increasingly complex world. Concluding on a heartfelt note, she concluded by congratulating the people who contributed in organising the MUN. Subsequently, Ma'am Priti Goyal, further elucidated the importance of staying informed and the vital role of diplomacy in shaping global understanding.

Thereafter, the Secretary General, Piya Salecha, with her vast experience and ardent passion for MUNs was invited to address the audience and declare the conference open, setting the stage for a productive and engaging deliberation





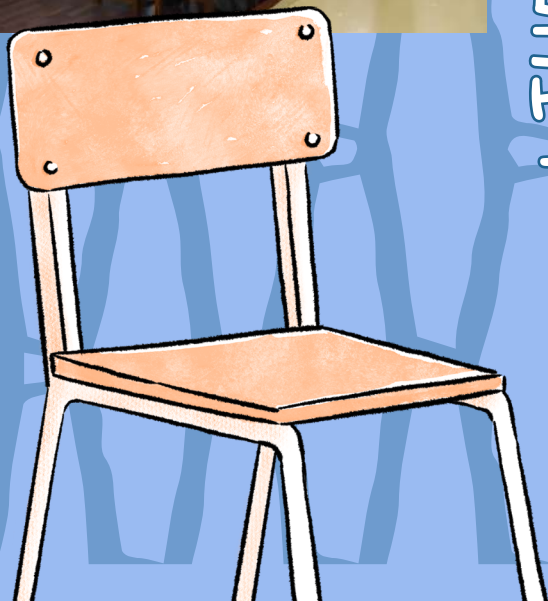
DOES THE CHAIR EVER SIT ON HER CHAIR?
