# DAY 2 BRIEF



Day 2 of the Model United Nations Conference witnessed unprecedented developments across all committees, marked by unexpected crises and remarkable diplomatic achievements.

The Group of Twenty committee began with Russia initiating the General Speakers List. Midway, a crisis broke: the U.S. Dollar crashed, and BRICS nations launched RAYA, a new global currency aiming to stabilize the economy. Heated debates followed on RAYA's role—whether to replace the Dollar, coexist with the Euro, or act temporarily. An unmoderated caucus and Round Robin allowed for strategic discussions and diverse viewpoints. Delegates shared national interests and formed alliances. A feedback session and Special Speakers List followed. Australia's Victory Speech claimed halting Taliban nuclear plants and restoring U.S. peace. Two draft resolutions were submitted, and voting concluded the day.

The Economic and Social Council opened with spirited participation in the General Speakers List, focusing on pressing international economic challenges. A mid-session crisis surrounding de-dollarization prompted immediate action, leading to productive round-robin discussions where delegates presented innovative solutions. An unmoderated caucus facilitated detailed clause-by-clause negotiations, resulting in a collaborative resolution that showcased the committee's ability to work toward consensus. The session concluded with a constructive feedback session that emphasized both accomplishments and areas for improvement, fostering continued diplomatic growth among participants.

The parliamentary proceedings began with an educational discussion on Naxalism, featuring insights from the Secretariat and delegates about its historical context and current implications, particularly in the Bastar region. The session intensified with heated debates on Waqf properties and minority rights, marked by strong statements from political leaders. A moderated caucus focused on the Citizenship Amendment Act generated significant discussion about minority concerns. The day took a dramatic turn with the emergence of Vijay Mallya's memoir alleging high-level corruption, leading to the dissolution of the NDA government and Supreme Court intervention. Following investigations, the NDA successfully defended itself against the allegations. The committee concluded with another substantive debate on CAA-related issues and Manipur violence, ending on a lighter note with a fun session.

Throughout these diverse proceedings, delegates demonstrated exceptional adaptability and diplomatic prowess, navigating both planned agenda items and unexpected crises while maintaining focus on achieving meaningful outcomes. The day's events highlighted the conference's capacity to simulate real-world challenges while fostering collaborative problem-solving among participating nations.



# CLOSING CEREMONY



The Closing Ceremony of the second edition of RKKMUN 2025 marked the end of two days filled with intense debate, diplomacy, and meaningful discussions on 4th July 2025. Held in the RKK Auditorium, the event began with comperes Harianshika Shekhawat and Deetya Vangani warmly welcoming the Chief Guest, Mrs. Seema Baxi, Dean Academics (Seniors), along with teachers, parents, and delegates.

You freeze for a second. Then something shifts.

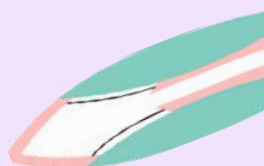
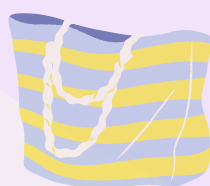

Ahaana wore a dark blue kurta with tripod, camera, lenses and multiple bags that carried weird photography stuff, only to look like the most professional photographer

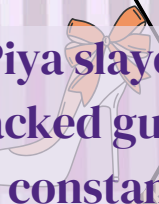
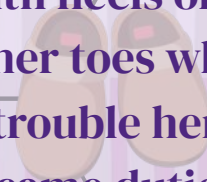
Rudrakshi ate with her light blue kurta, pink dupatta and classy glasses making it elemental writer core

Mayurakshi slayed with her earrings, green kurta, camera handbag and a cutesy vibe

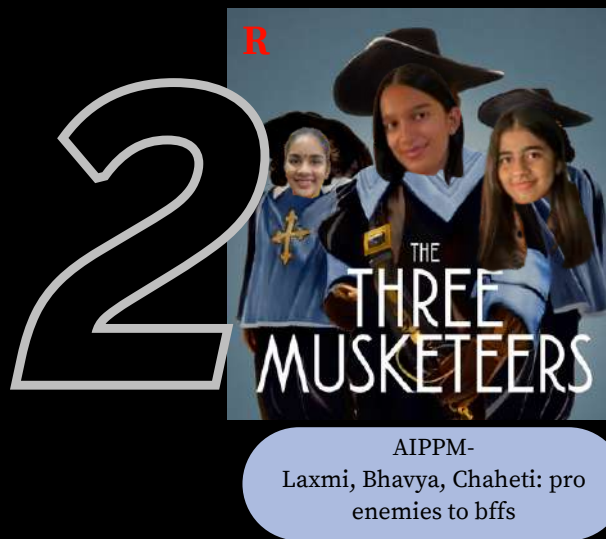
## In the Shoes of The Secretariat

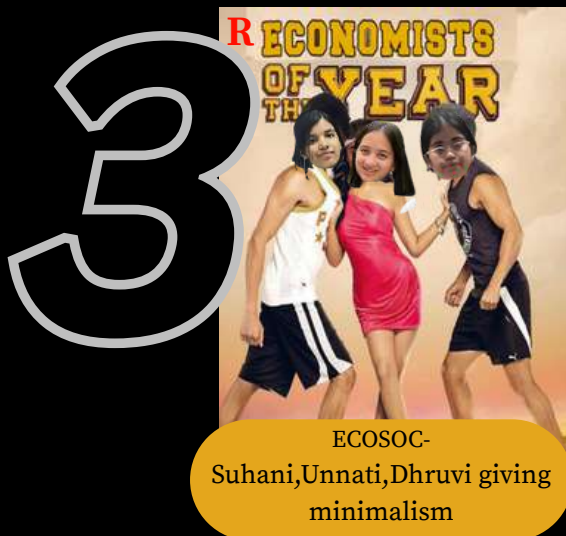

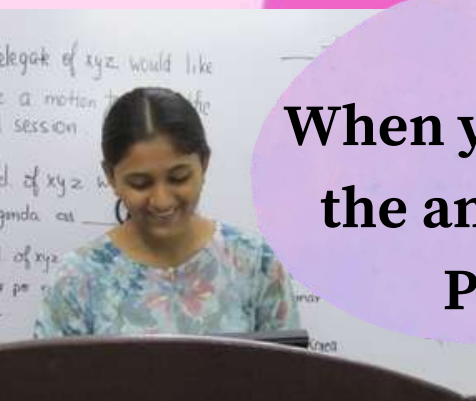

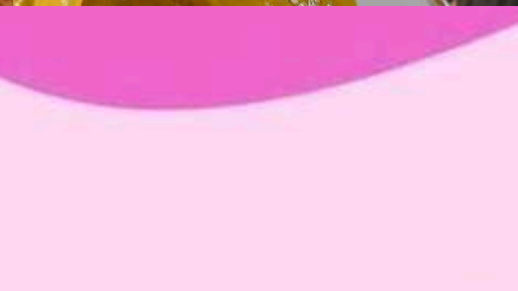
