Day 2 of RKK<mark>MUN'24</mark>

The committee began with an unmoderated caucus, where delegates lobbied and showed their negotiation skills. This was followed by a session from the Chair on writing a General Speaker's List (GSL) and techniques of making your research useful. After roll call, delegates delivered speeches full of solutions . Many Points of Information (POIs) were raised and promptly answered. An open debate challenge on "Countering Islamophobia" took place in which the Chair came in as the surprise delegate of Russia to create spark in the committee. The UK then introduced a moderated caucus on "Providing economic relief to victims of terrorism," where delegates discussed about their policies followed by an unmoderated caucus for the Draft Resolution where 2 blocs were formed-The USA and UK bloc and The China- Pakistan bloc. The Draft Resolution which constituted of amazing solutions was passed and the committee passed beautifully with a concluding feedback session.

DISEC kicked on with a rapid unmoderated caucus wherein the lobbied functionally, whereafter the delegates looked for the sharing of the best approaches to the culture of cyber reliability and building momentum towards international action. All of the delegates pointed out their countries' initiatives focusing on continuous training of employees about cyber threats and practices. At last, after tiring paperwork the committee passed with good majority. At last, the draft resolution by the delegates of USA, Japan, UK, France passed with majority of the votes.

The Essence of Diplomacy and Solutions




The ticking clock serves as a reminder of the urgency of addressing global crises and drafting resolutions. Roman numbers evoke the deep historical context
