• Adwitiya Saxena was awarded the 'Best Speaker' of Finals in Multi Format English Debate.












# Holy Trinity College, Argentina (RS Zoom Postcard)



# Workshops taken by RKK's Teachers

Mrs Akhileshwari Rathore and Salome Motha Martin- A Workshop on "Changing classrooms to Activity Based Learning Centres to facilitate Capacity Building for Foundational Educators" was conducted on 06.08.2024 aimed to enhance the skill set of teachers to align with the NCF FS 2022 framework, focusing on holistic child development. **Key Takeaways** 

- Panchkosha Vikas: The workshop emphasized the importance of addressing the physical, mental, emotional, and spiritual dimensions of a child through activity-based learning.
- Activity-Based Learning: The session highlighted various play-way methods like dramatic play, fantasy play, exploratory play, and environmental play. It also introduced the concept of 'My Learning Trains' and the 'Jadui Pitara' for resource management.
- Classroom Management: The workshop stressed the significance of individual, pair, small group, and team activities for holistic development.
- Language Development: The importance of L1 as the medium of instruction was emphasized, along with the role of storytelling and phonics in language development.
- Foundational Numeracy: The training introduced a four-block approach to teaching numbers, including math talks, skill teaching, skill practice, and math games.

Overall, the workshop was a valuable step towards exchange of ideas for the betterment of the quality of education for foundational stage students.



Mrs Megha Rana-A presentation was given on how a Pre-Primary day can be planned. A detailed information about how different activities and competitions can be integrated in academics in a fun way among children were discussed. Firstly planning and importance of good assembly practices like prayer, phonics, rhymes, zumba, yoga etc were brought up. A detailed information about special assembly, thematic assembly and celebrations was shared. Use of integrated approach, development of different domains, achieving the goals etc were focused on.





# Workshops taken by RKK's Teachers

10th August- "I cannot make teach anybody anything, I can only make them think" - SOCRATES. An interactive session was conducted by Ms. Deepika Ojha on Saturday (10/8/24) for the teachers of Pre- Primary and Primary departments. The agenda of the session was: "Creating a happy classroom by using multiple teaching strategies". The modern Education system, designed to make the learners self sufficient and ready to compete the challenges imposed by world education arenas is fueled by technology unlike the conventional education system. Mrs Vimlesh Garg- 22nd August 2024- Keeping NCF in mind, the focus was to bring about Panchkoshas development of children while teaching an EVS topic of Water Cycle. Music, rhymes, story, hand movements, teaching aids, quiz and above all feelings of gratitude and thankfulness can all be integrated to create that half an hour as the most memorable experience for students. The practice also focused on building up and strengthening the scientific temperament amongst students by adapting Heuristic method of teaching and leaving the children to broaden their imagination by asking open ended questions.
