Welham Boys' School, Dehradun (RS Service Project at Deoli)

'Have an attitude of gratitude', **rightly said by Welham Boys' School.** Six students - Paridhi Mehta, Suhani Baheti, Aditi Shekhawat, Natasha Misra, Yashvi Jain, Aditi Jaju with their Teacher Escort Ms Khushboo Changra participated in **Round Square Service Project hosted by Welham Boys' School, in Deoli (Bharatpur) from 1st February to 2nd February 2023.** Students boarded their train on the 31st January with high spirits and curiosity to learn and explore about the village life and help the unprivileged for the betterment of the community. They were warmly welcomed by the host school, at Udai Vilas Palace. After dinner, the delegates assembled in the conference room for a briefing session about the 2 days of project.

In this Round Square Project, 8 member schools participated from across the country with 6 delegates from each school like Mayo College Ajmer, Vidya Devi Jindal School, Hisar, Pathways World School, Gurgaon, Welham Boys' School, Welham Girls' School, The Punjab Public School, Nabha, and Rajmata Krishna Kumari Girls' Public School, Jodhpur. A student from Welham Boys' School briefed all the delegates about it, followed by an interesting presentation by the Chairman and Ma'am Principal of the school on Bharatpur and the motive behind choosing Deoli as the village for the service project. Continued, by remarks from Mr Rajeev Bhatia and Ms Monica that ended with a short ice breaking session and was indeed a fun filled activity. At 6 in the morning with 6 teams, 6 delegates from each school, in a 6 walled room, no one knows each other, yes a dream like experience indeed. Off the participants would go to watch birds, in the Keoladeo National Park which is recognised as one of the world's most important bird breeding and feeding ground. A surreal experience, to witness different species of birds, although the weather was utterly cold & frigid. Students learnt a lot about birds and travelling in the rickshaw was quite an awesome experience. On reaching Deoli participants were busy making tons of new friends, making stools, weaving stools, learning new words from them and indeed the traditional attire they wore was very diverse. The wall students painted, a thoughtful one, about service, caring, sharing, bonding and Global warming. The haveli they went was quite an experience, felt like a living fable, folklore. The visit enabled the delegates to experience the rich heritage and legacy of Deoli village, which will be always in hearts, evergreen. 2nd day, the participants went back to the village, completed unfinished work, followed by a presentation from Barefoot College International, about their methods and motives of helping the villagers. Then, they were divided into two groups, one for making Sanitary Napkins and other for making Solar Lanterns. Both the groups, learnt new skills, team work, sewing, working with circuits, using a melting machine, testing products and service indeed. Followed by, a Street Play by each school on different awareness and apprehension discourses. RKK team performed a street play on, 'Menstrual Hygiene and Menstrual Cycle'. Everyone was felicitated with Certificates. with this, the evening came to an end and schools departed. RKKians made many friends from all over the country and their memories with them will last forever. The visit enabled their experience to the rich culture & sustainable environment of villages, crucial global issues imbibing the responsibility to become an empowered global citizen.





Service week celebrated by RKK ('Hand in Hand' - 'Khushiyon Ka Safar')

Student Exchange Children are the same everywhere — bright smiles, inquisitive minds and twinkling in their eyes. Yet there is a huge gap in the quality of education and digital skills that are available to students in urban public schools and their counterparts in rural and government schools. The education deficit and digital literacy gap between India and Bharat (भारत) is already huge. The covid-19 pandemic enforced closure of schools further widened the gap to alarming proportions. Most students in good schools in large cities switched to online learning mode with relative ease whereas most rural/ government school students suffered due to lack of access to devices, trained teachers, digital curriculum content and regular assessments. There is some heartening news in this gloomy situation that gladdens hearts and minds. RKK, one among the few well-meaning institutions across the country, genuinely concerned about the education status in government schools, came forward to take small yet concrete steps to ensure there is equitable access to learning opportunities for all children in Jodhpur region.

In association with IN-DEED Foundation, a Trust, working to provide quality education through dedicated youth volunteers harnessing technology as a tool, RKK collaborated 'Hand in Hand' – 'Khushiyon Ka Safar' consecutive 2 days' program, which aimed to provide the right environment and opportunities to children so that they can fulfil their potential and realize their dreams.

Under the aegis of Service pillar, student exchange programs are conducted frequently between students of RKKGPS and government schools to encourage peer-learning, information sharing and uninhibited expression of thoughts and ideas.

On Saturday 04th February 2023, 40 students of Class IX from - Mahatma Gandhi Government School at Pabupura and BJS Colony Jodhpur, visited RKKGPS campus spending the entire day here. They were taken on a guided tour of Digital Classrooms, E-Labs, Science-Labs, Music, Art, Dance and Fine Arts Rooms and the School Library. Art Classes were followed by Recreational Activities conducted by RKKians. The visiting team was treated to a hearty breakfast and lunch by the host school RKK. Later, the students went to the Shakti Centre where Sanitary Napkins are made by volunteers and women from underprivileged background. Instructions on the importance of personal hygiene and its correlation to health was provided to the Class IX government school students. A Sanitary Napkin pack was gifted to each of the 40 visitors. Pick up and drop of students was done by RKK.

This was a real eye-opener for the government school girls and their enthusiasm and excitement was palpable. The response and feedback was very positive. Government school students were very impressed with the equipment and facilities as well as the open and encouraging environment, the deep personal involvement of teachers, the freedom and responsibility given to students and most of all by how smart and confident the students of RKKGPS were. They found a stark contrast with the conditions in their schools. The purpose of this interaction is manifold:

- Giving exposure to government school students of a world of possibilities that can be explored if they work harder and strive to achieve better results and bigger opportunities.
- Making students aware of the huge gap that exists between the private and government schools in terms of infrastructure, facilities, quality, mode and delivery of education.
- Motivating students to share knowledge and experience with their peers thereby promoting a spirit of camaraderie and fruitful volunteerism among youth.






Shirakatsy Lyceum, Armenia (RS Zoom Postcard)






Wycliffe College, Toronto, Canada (Round Square World Wise Conversation)
