

Singapore International School, Mumbai (RS Zoom Postcard)



Mayo College Girls' School, Ajmer (MCGSMUN)

On 14th April 2024, ten students - Subhadra Kumari, Pankhuri Sharma, Nandani Khichi, Adwitiya Saxena, Divyanshi Chail, Adhya Dudi, Gayatri Rathore, Shailja Soni, Somya Singh & Darshana Anwala with Ms Jyoti Ratan Singh entered into the arena of the **12th Edition of Model United Nations organized by Mayo College Girls' School from 14th to 17th April 2024.** The theme of this year's conference edition was *"Tamso Maa Jyotirgamay"* which translates to "Lead from Darkness to Light". Here words were not mere rhetoric but were the building blocks of peace, understanding, and progress. The MUN witnessed 21 elite schools from all over India with 263 delegates taking part in six different committees. The Conference began with Opening Ceremony and the introductory session that served as a gateway for delegates to familiarize themselves with rules, procedures and the spirit of diplomatic engagement, igniting their passion for global affairs. The next day commenced with the various committee sessions with broad agendas that tackled real world issues. The IPC introduced the assigned committees to the delegates and they moved to their respective venues. The committee saw a number of articles on all the committee agendas.

The session of the UNFPA committee commenced with the delivering of opening statements on the agenda – Enhancing Global Collaboration for Women's Bodily Autonomy and Equal Access to Reproductive Health Services. Once the opening statements concluded, the committee entered the phase of formal debate. During this period, delegates presented their arguments and perspectives on the agenda, engaging in thoughtful and informed discourse. The United Nations General Assembly set on the agenda – Assessing the Global Refugee Crises and the Safety of Refugees firstly moved into the General Speakers list. The committee further moved deeper into the discussion about displacement of refugees through a moderated caucus. The OPEC convened to tackle the pressing issue of addressing volatility in oil prices and its global economic impact. Deliberations had focused on identifying factors contributing to supplydemand imbalances, with emphasis on geopolitical tensions amplifying oil volatility. Discussions were centred on strategies to mitigate the impact of USA sanctions on oilproducing nations, which exacerbate market instability. During the Model United Nations Security Council session, delegates engaged in lively discussions on the Crisis in the Middle East. Sub topics like need for humanitarian aid and the recognition of the terrorist groups were also discussed. However, the session's most dramatic moment came when the President of the United States made a statement that the nation would no longer unequivocally align with Israel and instead recognized Palestine, reshaping the geopolitical landscape. The session concluded with a sense of anticipation as delegates grappled with the implications of their decisions. Adhya Dudi and Darshana Anwala took an active part in the committee as the The double delegation of Adwitiya Saxena and Pankhuri Sharma delegates of Brazil. representing the Bolivarian Republic of Venezuela in OPEC won a Special Mention. The conference planned engaging evening carnivals and DJ party including the Principal's Dinner where the students interacted and grew diplomatic and friendly bonds.




Ashbury College in Canada (RS Zoom Postcard)

A significant aspect discussed was the correlation between attendance and credit points. The Dean elucidated how regular attendance is pivotal in accruing credit points, as it signifies students' commitment to their education and active engagement in the learning process.

Following the comprehensive overview, the floor was opened for a Q & A session, allowing staff members to seek clarification and engage in interactive discussions. Various queries related to the implementation of the NCrF, assessment methodologies and its impact on teaching practices were addressed adeptly by the Dean.

The orientation session proved to be enlightening and enriching, equipping staff members with a thorough understanding of the National Credit Framework. It served as a precursor to the forthcoming academic year, empowering educators to adapt their pedagogical approaches in alignment with the evolving assessment paradigm.

Teachers' Workshop with School Counsellor

The school counsellor conducted an interactive workshop on **2nd April 2024** on "Art of Connection" with the goal of building stronger relationships amongst the teachers and students. In order to improve connectivity between students and teachers the workshop focused on investigating various facets of interpersonal interactions, communication techniques, and emotional intelligence. It aimed to create awareness of the role that connectedness plays in creating a positive learning environment through Playfulness Quotient (PQ) in schools. Doable tactics for voice modulation, enhancing dialogue and fostering wholesome connections were shared.

An introduction to the idea of connectedness and its importance in fostering student achievement in the classroom and overall well-being preceded the workshop. The school counsellor stressed how important it is to have supportive relationships in order to foster a feeling of community and belongingness in the classroom where every child feels special. The importance of promoting values like- cooperation, togetherness, kindness and discipline through regular assemblies was also discussed. Various interpersonal circumstances, roleplaying exercises and real-life scenarios were employed for the same. This gave participants the opportunity to practise active listening, empathy, and conflict resolution strategies.

The programme also covered the significance of compathy ,emotional control and selfawareness in developing deep relationships with others. In order to handle stress, build resilience, and develop a positive outlook, participants were urged to consider their own feelings and actions.

The counsellor discussed four types of recognitions that a teacher can use during in class in order to help a child feel special and heard. The teachers were also encouraged to share their best practices with each other to feel empowered and employ creative methodologies.

"When care is shown, connection prevails and when connection prevails, positive change happens".






PRE- PRIMARY & -PRIMARY EVENTS
