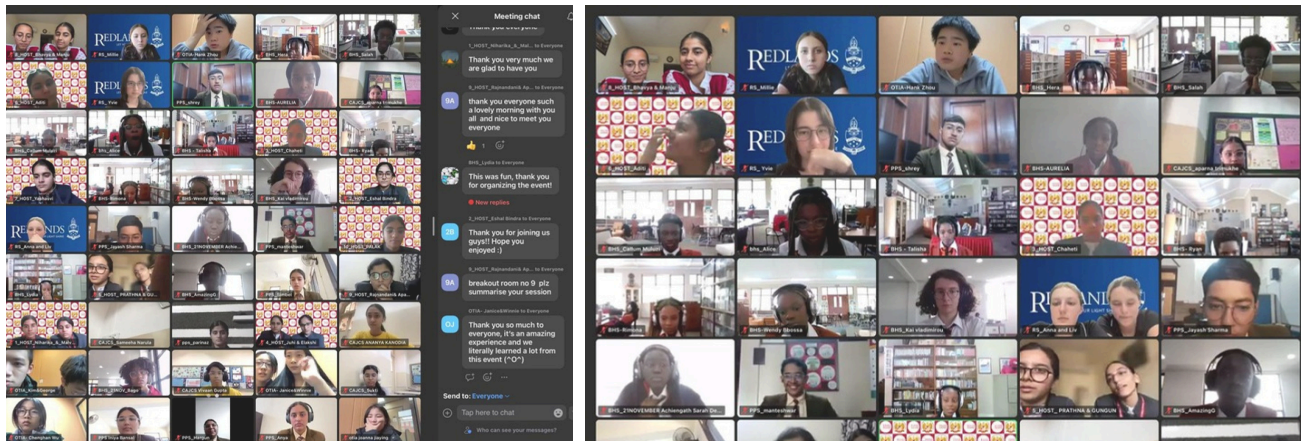
The Round Square Geography Lab Session was successfully hosted by the young geographers of school on **21st November 2024**. The session commenced with the introductory remarks by the representatives of our school briefing the participants on the main theme, “Rivers: lifeline or threats”. 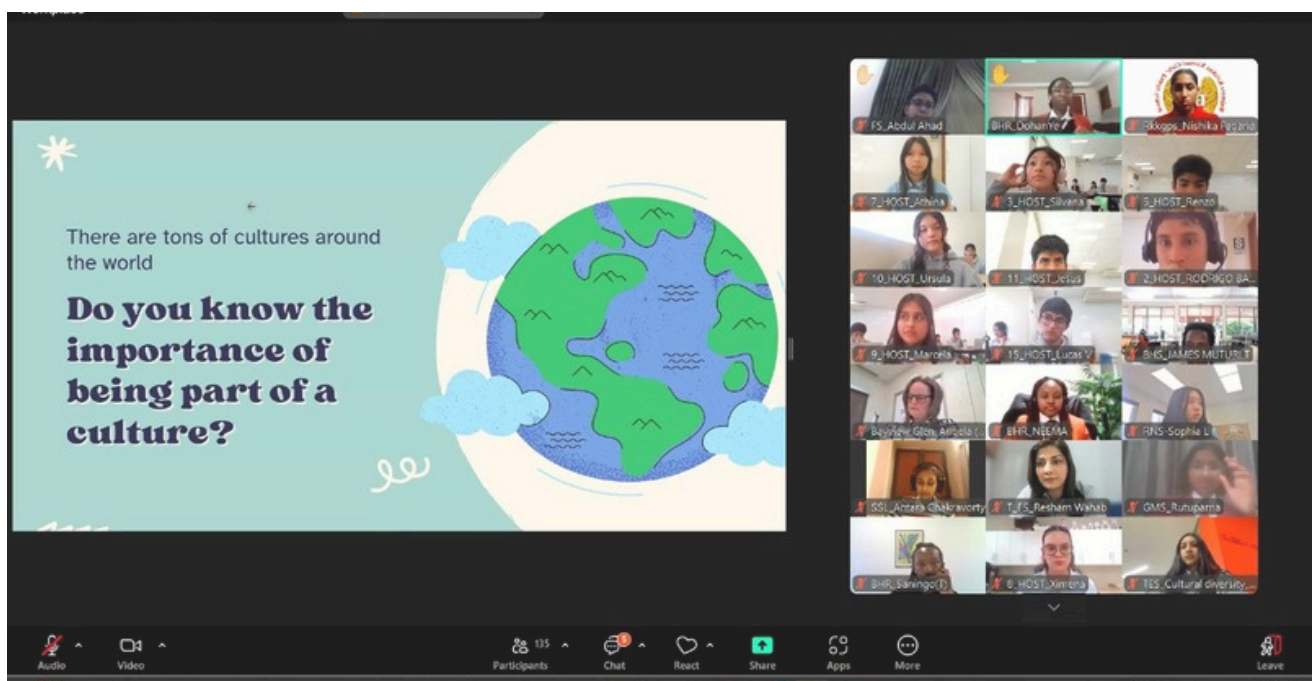

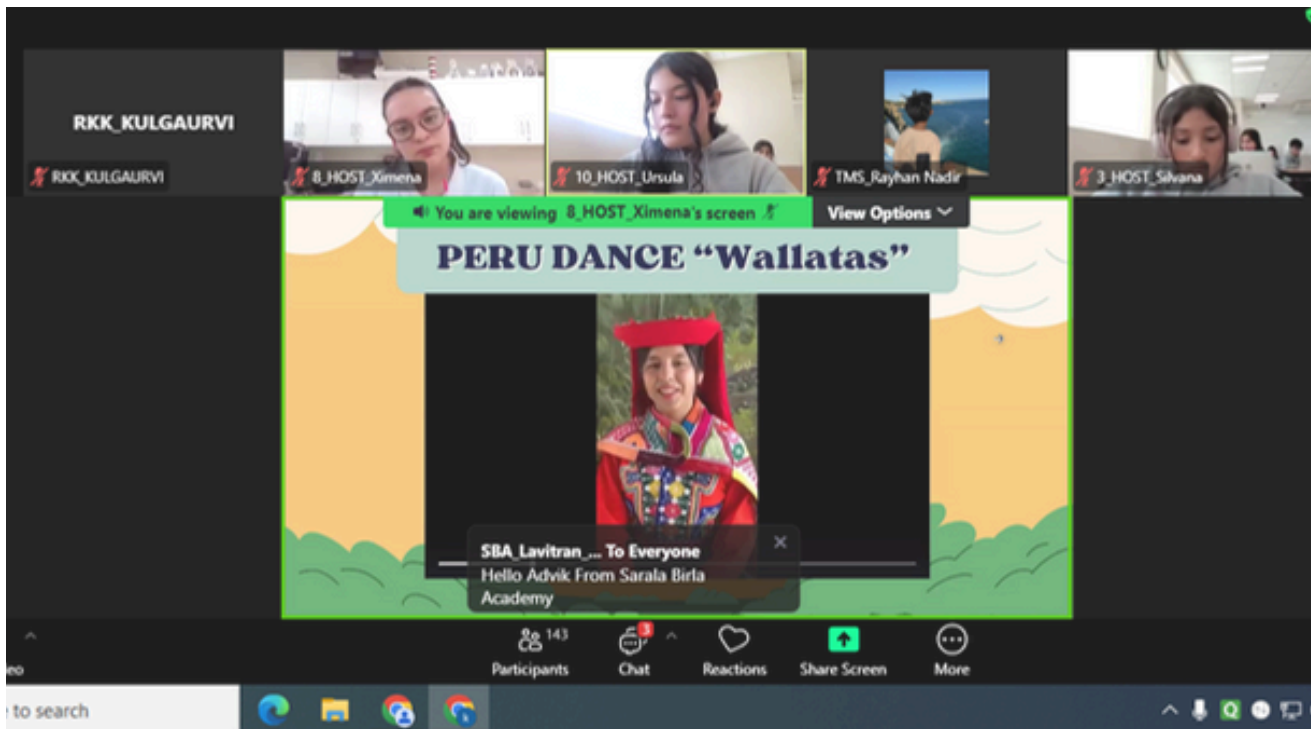
Skill Development: Participants improved their presentation skills and gained valuable experience in teamwork and virtual communication.

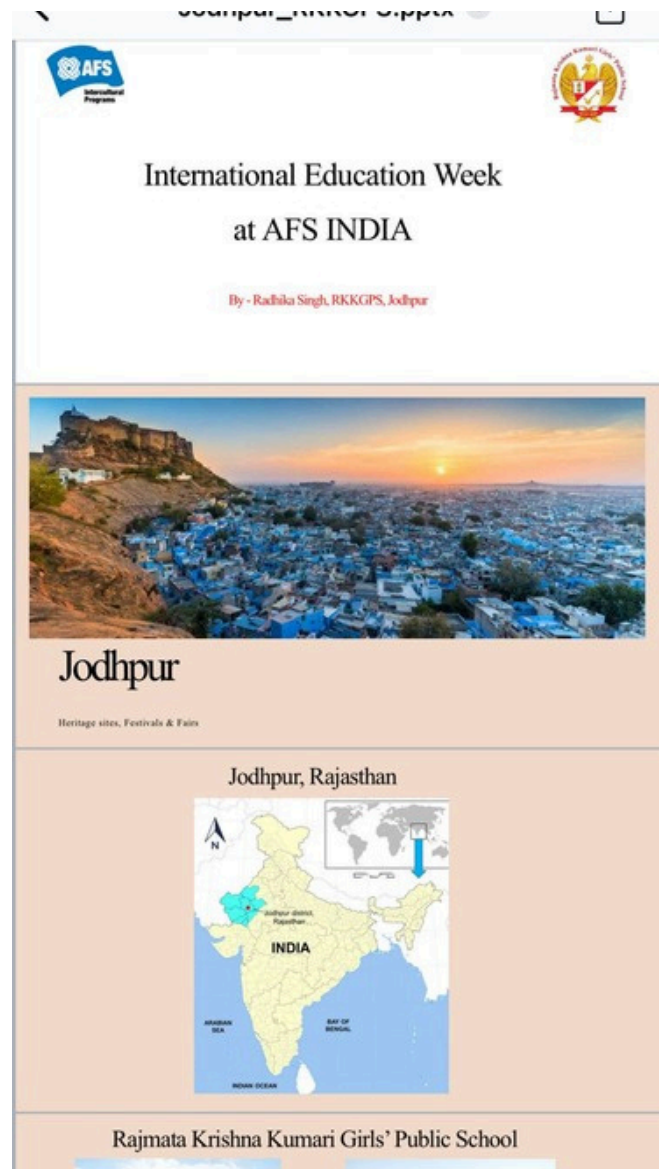
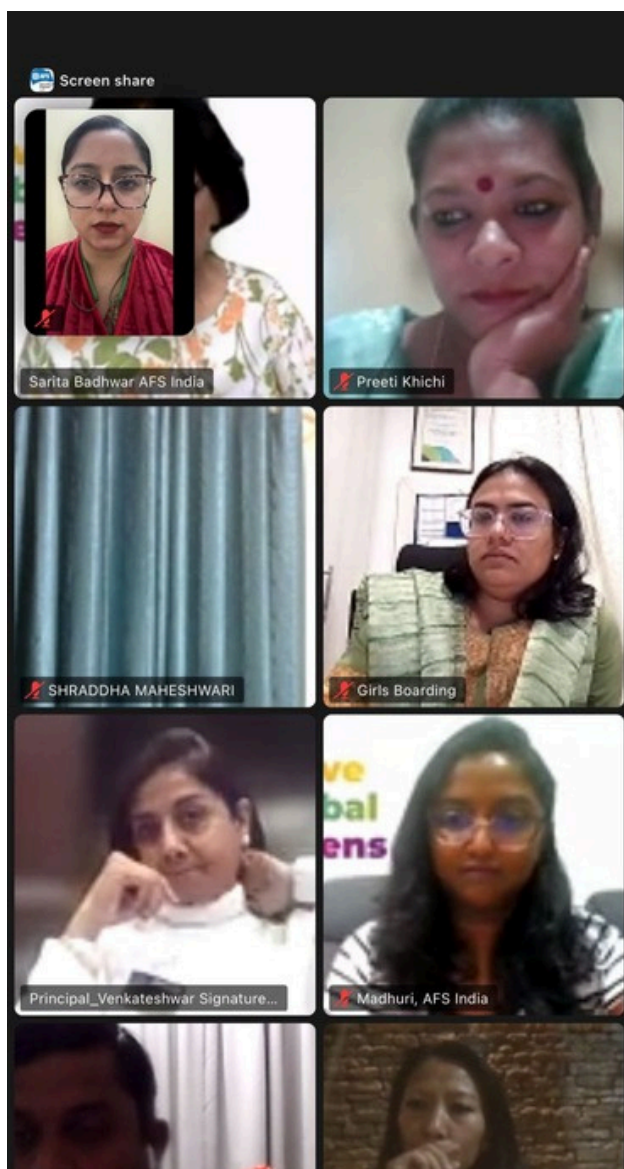


Virtual Meet & Greet for Global Educators Celebrating International Educators Week (IEW)

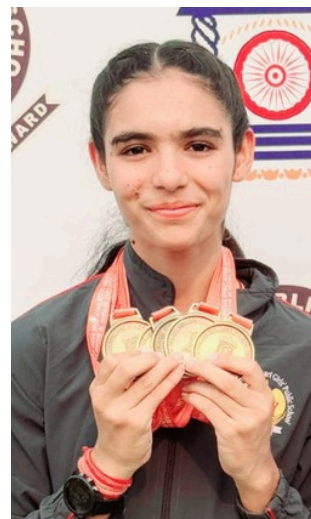

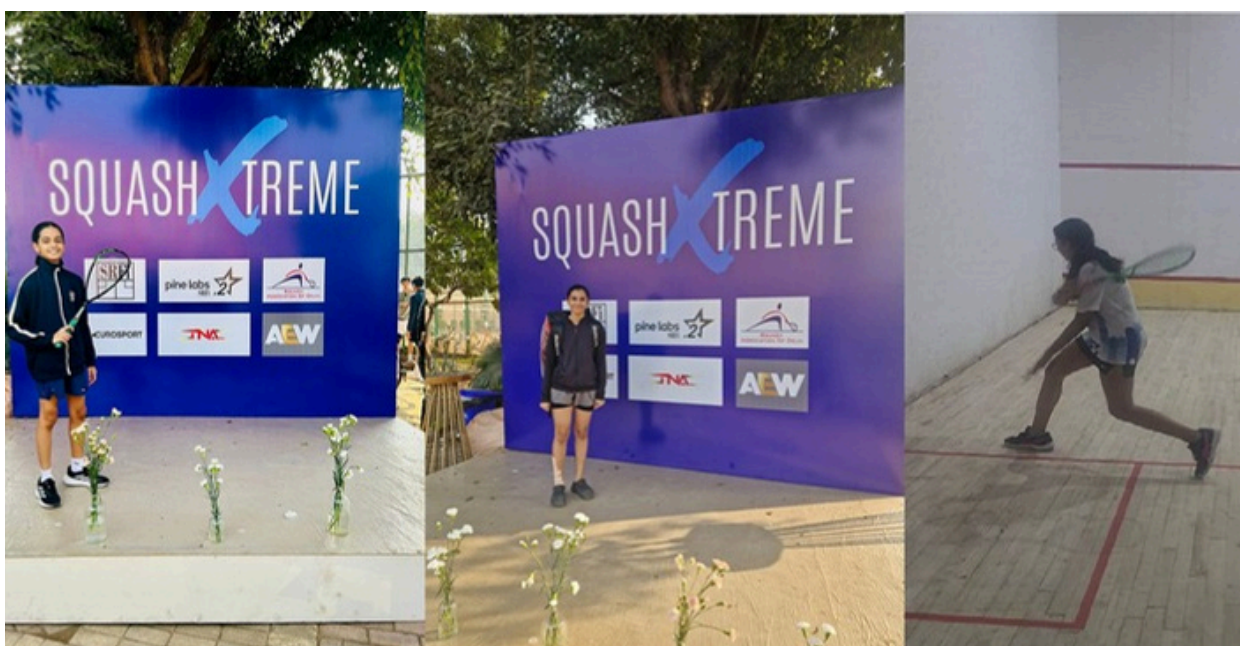
