The conference commenced with a captivating Opening Ceremony, setting the tone for the entire event. It featured spectacular Flag March ceremony followed by enlightening Keynote address by distinguished speaker, Mr. Bhalu Mondhe. He delivered an insightful speech on nature and sustainability. The next key note address was by an avid bird enthusiast, Mr. Dev Kumar Vasudevan. His inspiring speech emphasized the importance of environmental conservation and highlighted the unique role that birds play in maintaining ecological balance. Delegates were organized into Barazza Groups, each named after a National Park in Madhya Pradesh like Kanha, Gir, Jim Corbett, Kaziranga etc. This innovative approach fostered a sense of camaraderie and teamwork among participants. In Community Service, the delegates accomplished many activities like – Bed sheet Painting, Bottle Painting, Wall Painting, Block Painting, Poster Making and Ladoo Making. The next learning experience came from the Mandu Exploration EXPLORATION. All the delegates explored the historical town of Mandu. This excursion provided a glimpse into India's rich heritage and allowed participants to appreciate the architectural marvels, history and cultural diversity of Mandu, that has a fascinating past, dating back to the 6th century. Nestled amidst the Vindhya Range, the city is home to a plethora of architectural wonders, reflecting the grandeur of its medieval rulers.

The delegates visited many historical sites at Mandu like, Rani Rupmati's Pavilion, Baz Bahadur Palace, Jahaz Mahal, Jami Masjid and Hoshang Shah's Tomb. The Conference concluded with a vibrant Closing Ceremony, featuring cultural performances from all the participating schools. Delegates showcased their talents through dance, music and drama, celebrating "Vasudev Kutumbhkam," that defined the Round Square conference. It was a resounding success, fostering global connections and promoting a deeper understanding of the world. Nestled along the majestic foothills of the Aravalis, Pathways World School greeted the participants with a chilly breeze, yet warm and welcoming faces. 
# The Assam Valley School, Assam (RS Zoom Postcard)




# Ashbury College, Canada (RS Zoom Postcard)




# Palmer Trinity School, USA (RS Zoom Postcard)

On 31st January 2024, a team comprising 6 boarders — Angel Semlani, Mahimaba Sarwaiya, Vidushi Digga, Trisha Talesara, Purvi Jain, Jayani Singh Tomar with their Student Leader Surbhi Udawat participated in the RS Postcard hosted by Palmer Trinity School on the theme, "Mental Health in Teens: Why Should Schools Promote Mental Wellbeing?". A brief on the theme was given as soon as the call commenced. It started on a fruitful note with a presentation displayed by the host school. Next, students were divided into different breakout rooms. Questions were asked from each participant such as, How does your school support mental well being? Why was mental health important during the COVID 19 pandemic? RKKians actively participated in discussions and were able to relate to the theme as RKK has conducted and participated from time to time in many mental health programmes to raise awareness about its importance among the students. School has always encouraged physical activities such as Yoga, Zumba, Self Defence, Meditation etc and has fostered a positive environment for open communication among all. It was a very encouraging and innovative conference to work towards a better tomorrow and how small initiatives can make huge differences.







#### STUDENTS' WORKSHOP

(Traffic Rules and Road Safety)

RKK organized a workshop on Traffic Rules and Road Safety on **31st January 2024** which was led by Traffic Inspector, Mr. Ramesh Khiriya. The Workshop was an initiative as per the government protocols to celebrate the Road Safety Month. It aimed to enhance awareness and understanding of crucial traffic regulations, fostering a safer road environment for all the school students. The session was attended by students of classes VIII, IX and XI. Inspector Ramesh generated awareness in students about Speed Limits and Safety Measures, Traffic Signal, Importance of Lane Discipline, Drinking and Driving, Underage Driving, Penalties for Traffic Violations, Vehicle Insurance, Good Samaritan Law and answered their queries in an Interactive Q & A round.

The Workshop began with an in-depth discussion on speed limits on various road types and the correlation between speed and the severity of accidents. The session also covered safety measures like wearing seatbelts and helmets. Participants were educated about the significance of traffic signals and their role in managing intersections. Practical scenarios were presented to illustrate appropriate responses to different signals. The facilitator also emphasized the importance of adhering to designated lanes and avoiding overtaking from the wrong side. He discussed how proper lane discipline contributes to smoother traffic flow and reduces accidents. A critical segment focused on the dangers of driving under the influence of alcohol or drugs. Legal consequences and alternatives such as designated drivers or public transportation were discussed. The workshop addressed the issue of underage driving, emphasizing the legal consequences and potential dangers associated with it. Educational materials and real-life examples were presented to underscore the negative impact of allowing minors to operate vehicles. Inspector Ramesh provided a comprehensive overview of the penalties associated with various traffic violations, including fines, license suspension, and legal consequences. Special attention was given to the consequences of underage driving, outlining strict penalties for both the underage driver and the responsible guardian.

The importance of vehicle insurance was discussed in the session as well. He also mentioned how due to the reel culture and also to avoid any police related formalities, people refrain from helping a person in need after an accident. Therefore, the good Samaritan law can help the citizens feel more safe and willing to help the injured. Participants were encouraged to ask questions and share their experiences, creating an interactive platform for clarifying doubts and reinforcing key concepts. The workshop concluded with a reminder of the shared responsibility for Road Safety and a pledge that every student took to be an active and aware citizen by prioritizing safety before fun. Inspector Mr. Ramesh expressed gratitude for the active participation by the students and the staff and urged attendees to apply the knowledge gained, contributing to a safer community.


