## REPRODUCTIVE AND SEXUAL HEALTH AWARENESS IN ADOLESCENTS BY Dr. NAYANIKA



On 31st January 2025, a session on Reproductive and sexual health awareness for Adolescents was conducted for students of Classes VIII, IX, and X. Dr. Nayanika Gaur, a distinguished alumnus of the school with MBBS and MS degrees in Obstetrics and Gynaecology, led the session. As an Infertility Specialist, she currently manages her own clinic, Kirti IVF. The interactive session provided valuable insights into adolescent health and well-being.

Dr. Nayanika commenced by defining "Reproductive Health," emphasizing the WHO definition that describes it as a state of complete physical, mental, and social well-being, not merely the absence of disease or infirmity in all matters related to the reproductive system. She highlighted the importance of understanding what is normal and not normal in reproductive and sexual health.

A key point of the session was the distinction between sex and sexuality. Dr Nayanika emphasized that emotional stability is the cornerstone of healthy sexuality. She provided valuable insights on adolescence, which spans from 9 years of age to 24 sometimes, with teenagers being only a part of this group.

Addressing common concerns related to menstruation, Dr Nayanika answered questions such as whether menstruation is normal or if it causes weakness. She creatively used the popular animated character Anna from the movie Frozen to explain the stages of worry during menstruation, making the discussion relatable and engaging for the audience.

She also provided insights into different menstrual hygiene products, with a focus on the sanitary pad, and briefly explained the roles of hormones like estrogen and progesterone. Furthermore, she discussed contraception and condom usage, stressing the importance of saying "No" at a young age and how abstinence is a safe choice to prevent AIDS/HIV.

Dr. Nayanika highlighted the importance of cervical cancer awareness and the availability of vaccines to prevent it. She concluded the session by answering questions from the audience and encouraging self-respect and body positivity, quoting Marilyn Monroe:

TO ALL THE GIRLS THAT THINK YOU'RE FAT BECAUSE YOU'RE NOT A SIZE ZERO YOU'RE THE BEAUTIFUL ONE ITS SOCIETY WHO'S UGLY.

The session was highly informative and successfully fostered awareness and understanding among the students, empowering them with essential knowledge about reproductive and sexual health

#### The Beyond the Beaker – Microscale Chemistry Workshop CCL, IIT Gandhinagar



The Beyond the Beaker – Microscale Chemistry Workshop was conducted by the Centre for Creative Learning (CCL), IIT Gandhinagar, from 11th to 15th February 2025. It focused on innovative and engaging methods for teaching chemistry through microscale experiments. The workshop was organized by Mr. Manish Jain, who introduced the concept of microscale chemistry and its benefits and 90 participants attended workshop from different states of India.

A session by Mr. Shreesha Bhat and Ms. Nisha Pandey (Chemistry Experts) provided deep insights into chemistry experiments that require minimal resources but yield impactful learning. Another session was conducted by Mr. Vikram and Ms. Yasmeen Bhasin (Biology Expert), where we explored the interdisciplinary applications of microscale experiments. Mr. Abhijit led a creative session where he demonstrated funny and joyful toys based on science, making learning more engaging.

We learned how to perform experiments efficiently, reducing the need for frequent lab visits. Hands-on activities helped us understand chemical reactions in a fun and practical way. The workshop introduced us to cost-effective and eco-friendly chemistry teaching methods. We explored various small-scale experiments that require minimal chemicals and equipment.

This approach makes learning safer, more efficient, and accessible to all students. Collaborative learning and teamwork were key aspects of the sessions. The speakers encouraged us to think creatively and apply scientific concepts innovatively. We experienced firsthand how simple modifications can make experiments more effective. The sessions helped us understand the real-world applications of chemistry. We engaged in problem-solving activities that enhanced our analytical skills. Discussions on scientific curiosity and innovation were an integral part of the workshop. It provided exposure to new teaching methodologies that make science more interesting. A cultural meet was also organized, where participants showcased amazing performances, making the event even more memorable. We realized the importance of making chemistry learning interactive and enjoyable. Overall, the workshop was a blend of science, creativity, and culture, making it a truly enriching experience.

The father looks at the child with anger most of the time and the child reaches the conclusion, 'I am bad.'" – Dr. Shelja Sen On the 22nd of February 2025, a transformative workshop titled "The Art of Connection" was conducted by Ms. Aashna Jain, School Counsellor, at RKKGPS. The session aimed to highlight the importance of building meaningful relationships between teachers and students to foster a supportive and encouraging learning environment.

The workshop commenced with an eye-opening activity where teachers role-played as students and educators, reading out common classroom scenarios. This engaging exercise shed light on the gap between teachers and students—the lack of awareness among teachers about students' backstories and, similarly, the students' limited understanding of their teachers' intentions.

Following this, the session explored the fundamental triggers that challenge teachers in maintaining composure when faced with difficult situations. By recognizing these triggers, teachers can work towards regulating their responses and fostering a more empathetic approach in their interactions.

A key focus of the workshop was on the impact of teacher communication on a student's self-esteem and confidence. The manner in which a teacher speaks can either uplift or demoralize a student, making it imperative to use positive, encouraging, and respectful language in classrooms.

Ms. Aashna then introduced the powerful mantra—"Connect Before Correct." To emphasize this, she shared insights from a survey conducted within the school, which examined the foundation of connection and its significance. The survey findings highlighted why students form stronger connections with certain teachers on social, emotional, and transformational levels, differing across age groups from middle to high school.

The session proceeded with a discussion on the most effective positive discipline strategies that teachers can implement through enhanced communication skills. These included:

- Practicing empathy and active listening
- Maintaining composure and using respectful language
- Publicly praising students while offering individual guidance in private
- Avoiding public humiliation
- Establishing and respecting healthy boundaries with students

The workshop concluded with an open discussion, where teachers shared their experiences, perspectives, and success stories. It was a moment of mutual agreement when Ms. Aashna stated, "When care is shown, connection prevails, and when connection prevails, positive change happens."
