- International Press Corps (IPC) with the responsibility to cover internal and global affairs with great accuracy and insight.

It celebrated linguistic diversity and expression. The students delivered an outstanding performance across various categories. In Sanskrit Shlok Ucharan, Vaiditi Kapuriya of class 9 secured 1st position in the Junior category, while Himadri Kaushik of class 12 secured 3rd position in the Senior category. Their combined efforts brought us the overall first position in the Sanskrit Shlok Competition and a chance to bring home the prestigious rolling trophy, “The Chal Vijayanti Trophy”.

Students responded thoughtfully and clearly, showcasing not only their knowledge but also their ability to think critically and articulate responses under pressure. Their answers reflected genuine understanding rather than rote memorization, which significantly enhanced the overall impact of the presentation. The session also succeeded in sparking curiosity and engagement among other participants. The unique aspects of Sambhar Lake—such as its salt-producing nature and seasonal transformation—captured attention and led to active participation through questions and discussions. This created an interactive learning environment where students were not just presenters but contributors to a shared exchange of ideas.

Importantly, the presentation served as a meaningful representation of Rajasthan's natural heritage. By focusing on a lesser-discussed yet significant site, students were able to highlight the richness and diversity of their own region. This fostered a sense of pride and responsibility, reinforcing the idea that understanding and preserving such natural wonders is essential. Overall, the activity was highly successful in raising awareness, encouraging participation, and building student confidence. It demonstrated how young learners, when guided effectively, can present with depth, clarity, and purpose—leaving a lasting impression while promoting both knowledge and appreciation of their local environment.

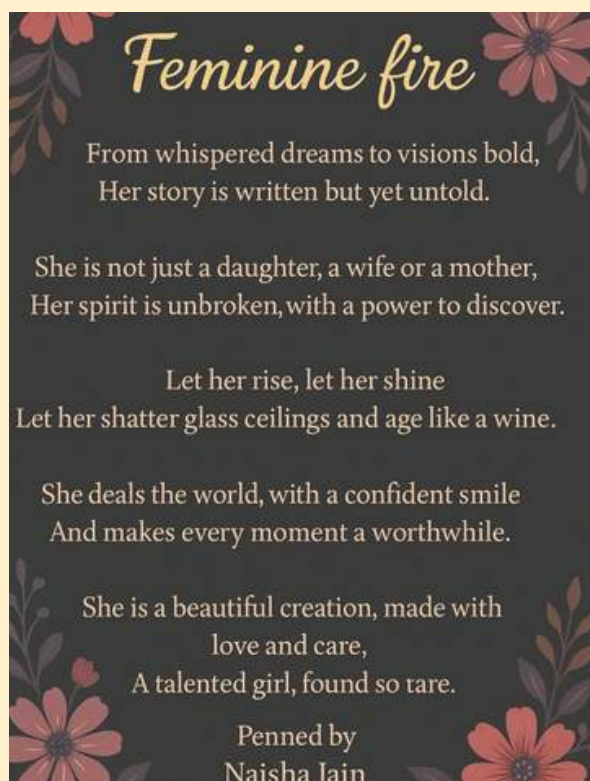

The teachers of Rajmata Krishna Kumari Girls' Public School, Jodhpur attended a workshop on "Computational Thinking and Artificial Intelligence" on Wednesday, **July 1, 2026**. **The workshop was conducted by Mr. Mikin Lala, an alumnus of IIT Roorkee and IIM Calcutta.** Computational Thinking and Artificial Intelligence has been introduced by CBSE for students of Classes III to VIII.

The workshop commenced with the Principal, Mrs Neera Singh welcoming the resource person and presenting him with a token of gratitude. Mr. Lala began the session by sharing a personal anecdote from his school days. He recalled how, despite scoring low marks in Mathematics in Class VII, his teacher, Mr. Godrej, chose to encourage rather than criticise him. His teacher motivated him to develop logical reasoning and analytical thinking, which eventually helped him excel in the subject. Mr. Lala explained that Computational Thinking is not merely a subject but an essential life skill. He introduced the four pillars of Computational Thinking—Decomposition, Pattern Recognition, Abstraction, and Algorithm Design—and emphasised that the goal of educators should not be limited to completing the syllabus but should focus on developing these vital skills in students.

During the first session, Mr. Lala gave a detailed presentation on the concepts of Computational Thinking. He engaged the teachers with a variety of puzzles and problem-solving activities, guiding them through the solutions and sharing useful techniques and strategies to approach such challenges effectively. The post-lunch session was largely interactive and hands-on. Teachers actively participated in the activities, applying the concepts they had learnt during the morning session. This was followed by an engaging question-and-answer session, which continued for nearly thirty minutes and helped clarify many practical aspects of implementing Computational Thinking in the classroom. The workshop concluded with the Dean Academics, Seniors, Mrs Seema Baxi expressing heartfelt gratitude to Mr. Mikin Lala for his valuable time and for enlightening the teachers about this important initiative. The session proved to be highly informative, engaging, and inspiring, equipping the teachers with practical insights into nurturing computational thinking skills among students.
